Children's Summer Programming 2018

Libraries Rock! Summer Reading Club for Children

Pick up a reading log in the library or print it online beginning June 4. Children from birth through age 10 use the same log. Young readers must listen to and/or read 20 books. Older readers must read for 5 hours. Return the completed log for prizes! Children may complete up to <u>four</u> logs. The last day for returning logs is Friday, July 27. The summer reading program is part of the national reading initiative of the Collaborative Summer Library Program and facilitated by the Texas State Library.
